

From Pastor Patrick:

Dear friends and church family,

Can I be real with you for a moment? Can I be vulnerable with you? Sometimes I'm not sure what to write for the newsletter. Each month, each week, each day I see these God moments happening. A God moment is where I see God active, present, a part of... whatever is before me. When this happens on mission trips, we share the story in the evening and at the end of the story everyone says, yaaaay God!

It could be a young man filled with energy and joy at living with God each and every moment. It might be the kindness of strangers reaching out to help – without knowing who they are helping. They just see a need and work to fill it.

The other day I saw a child stop and turn to help her little brother up, who had fallen and was just about ready to cut loose with tears. She couldn't have been more than 6 or 7 with her brother being about 2 or 3. They were both walking down the sidewalk a little ahead of mom and dad. The girl could have kept going knowing that mom or dad would pick little bro up. But she didn't wait for that. She stopped, turned, bent down and, encouraging her brother, helped him up by the arm.

That's something to commend her for! Great move big sis! You are beautiful and wonderful and helpful and loving. Not just for helping your little brother but for just being yourself. Just as you are.

Another God moment I see is when a church member visits our shut-ins – those unable to get to church anymore. This last month or two, whenever I visited someone, they would tell me... so and so was here just the other day. We had a great visit. It was so good to see her! And I am filled with joy. It means so much to those who used to be active in our church and who can be no longer. Their eyes light up and they chatter about the visit and my own heart is warmed.

Soon, Easter is going to be here. And we'll all witness a HUGE God moment. Jesus Christ will rise and we'll say "He is Risen. He is Risen Indeed!" And we might even say, yaaaay God! I wonder, what God moments you are seeing in your day to day lives? Where do you see God present? Who do you see God working through? These are great stories to be shared! They help explain why and how God is important to you.

May God bless you and keep you, nurture and sustain you, guide and direct you, now and always.

ST. MARK'S CONSISTORY MEETING

March 6, 2025

Ben Grunwald called the meeting to order at 6:05 p.m. Members present were Ben Grunwald, Tyler Bramstedt, Linda Schroeder, Jody Binversie, Judy Steinbeck, Lori Roelse and Brenda Miota. Pastor Schultz was absent.

Judy started us off with the financial report. She informed us that the surge protector installation was paid. Payment for the new website came from the Memorial Fund. The yearly insurance payment was also made even though we are seeking alternative insurance. Judy also told us she received a generous donation toward the parsonage residing project. Tyler made a motion to accept the report. Linda seconded. Motion carried.

The secretary's report was reviewed earlier online. I mentioned that Karen found one typing error which she fixed prior to posting it in the March newsletter. I also reported that an error was found by a member of the congregation in a previous report. I went back and corrected it. Lori made a motion to accept. Tyler seconded. Motion carried.

Ben went on to update us on the various projects underway.

- Bell tower and tuck pointed tabled
 - o Larry recently followed up with an email that Ken Klemme Masonry will be preparing an estimate
- Topsoil tabled
- · Carpet cleaning appointment schedule for April
- Trim painting Ben was encouraged to not pursue metal wrapping of the trim. He will begin seeking out painting quotes.

Last month, Pastor asked us to read the Introduction and Chapter 1 of the book *Just Say Yes*. Ben led us in a discussion in Pastor's absence. Chapter 1 listed out all the ways a church can say no, although we felt these pertained to a much larger congregation. Tyler mentioned that while our congregation used to be bigger with the presence of large, local farm families, our community is dwindling. Lori encouraged the celebration of our current, well-attended activities: Bunco, Sheepshead, Quilting, Gentleman's Breakfast and After Church Ladies Lunches. Ben noticed that when members propose ideas with well thought out plans, we support them and say yes. However, if suggestions are vague, they tend to get pushed aside. Jody shared that the Kiel UCC has been flourishing lately. She offered to reach out to a member of their congregation – maybe we can tap into their resources. We will read Chapter 2 and be ready for continued discussion next month.

Lori gave us a Family Day update. The date is set for September 7, 2025. It will be a combined service (30-45 minutes) with the sermon centered on family. They are hoping for childhood music and kid's songs. Service time hasn't yet been set (10:00 or 10:30?). Food will be served at 11:00. We will provide hamburgers and hot dogs. Members will be asked to bring salads and desserts to pass. Beverages available will be lemonade, water and coffee. There will be no cost, but a free will donation is encouraged. Spun Boutique will be on hand to make organic Cotton Candy. The event will be advertised in the bulletin, on posters and in the newsletter. Games will include a dunk tank (payment required to throw balls), the old fish pond, pick a duck, ladder toss, cornhole, croquet, and bingo. The event will take place rain or shine. Prize donations are welcome from the congregation. Their next meeting is set for April 23, 2025.

Ben followed up on the State Fire Sticker. He will check on the sticker on the boiler and take necessary action.

Some members of the consistory met last month with Melissa, a representative from Church Mutual Insurance. She reviewed our policy, showed us how we can earn some discounts and lower our premium. Since we have not heard back from her, Judy will reach out to follow up. She will also reach out to other local churches to ask who they use for insurance coverage.

St. James is looking to update their directory. We were asked if we had interest in joining them. We decided not to at this time.

In anticipation of the parsonage residing project, Ben will announce to the congregation over the course of the next three weeks that a vote will be held on March 30, 2025. Depending on total costs, we may need congregation approval. Please plan to be in attendance that Sunday. Thank you!

The Chili Dinner at St. James was a success. Thank you to all who stopped in. The proceeds will again benefit the Youth Fund. It remains to be decided who will lead the dinner in 2026.

Easter Lily cost has increased a bit. This year the cost will be \$13.00 per plant, again to be purchased from Millhome Nursery and Greenhouse.

Judy mentioned receiving a letter from the Haven Fire Department asking for \$10.00 dues to be paid for the year. She will send it out.

Upcoming Lenten services are set for March 12, 26, and April 9, 2025.

Looking ahead, we will be hosting Communion on Good Friday and Easter Sunday.

Our next meeting is scheduled for Thursday, April 3, 2025 at 6:00 p.m.

Tyler made a motion to close the meeting at 7:30 p.m. Linda seconded. Motion carried.

- Mission Statement display Pastor suggested we look for options on how to display our Mission Statement and/or Vision Statement. He'd like to see it in a prominent location on a wall. It was tabled for now and to be discussed at the next meeting.
- Pastor suggested that when we have new members join church, we should have a cake and coffee/water. Everyone agreed it was a good idea.
- Hymnals Pastor brought along copies of the hymnal that St. Marks uses called Worship and Rejoice. He suggested the option of moving to that hymnal which would make it easier to select songs for worship. The hymnal has more song choices and along with the traditional songs, has some new options. Pastor is going to talk to Randy and Cindy.
- Pastor Kim, representing the Wider Church, stopped in to share a special thank you to our congregation for the continued support. Our church members are making a difference.
 Pastor Kim also shared that there is a strong chance the Northeast Association will disappear.
- o Easter Lily forms are due March 23. The Easter Lilies will be purchased from Hartman's.
- Jason Riesterer found someone that is willing to fix our outside stairs for \$1500 or less.
 The steps will be replaced with 3 solid steps. A motion was made by Matt and seconded by Tanya to allow them to move forward when the weather warms up.
- Pastor shared information about a Catalyst Grant that is available to all churches. It is to be used for outreach in the community. He suggested we think about things we may have wanted to do and haven't been able to pursue because we didn't have the money or resources available. The grant supports innovative projects meeting critical needs in partnership with our community organization.


