Imposition of Ashes:

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ:

the early Christians observed with great devotion the days of our Lord's passion and resurrection, and it became the custom of the Church that before the Easter celebration there should be a forty-day season of spiritual preparation.

During this season those new to the faith were prepared for Baptism. It was also a time when those who had committed serious sins and had separated themselves from the community of faith were reconciled through repentance and forgiveness, and restored to the life of the Church.

In this way the whole congregation was reminded of the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the need we all have to renew our faith.

I invite you now to observe a holy Lent:

Renew yourself through prayer, repentance, and scripture - God's Holy Word. Refresh yourself in mind, body and spirit; be healed of wrong and sin. Be reunited, in God's great love, with Jesus Christ.

Come now, before a merciful God, Creator and Redeemer, to receive the imposition of ashes.

Sacrament of Holy Communion:

We give you thanks for the abundance of your steadfast love. As we are filled with your grace and mercy, as we are renewed in spirit. May you guide us and use us to bring about your reign of peace on earth. In the name of Jesus Christ, the holy one, we now pray:

And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. *Amen*.
