When I Survey the Wondrous Cross

Mark 14:32-42 ESV

Scripture Reading:

And they went to a place called Gethsemane. And he said to his disciples, "Sit here while I pray." And he took with him Peter and James and John, and began to be greatly distressed and troubled. And he said to them, "My soul is very sorrowful, even to death. Remain here and watch." And going a little farther, he fell on the ground and prayed that, if it were possible, the hour might pass from him. And he said, "Abba, Father, all things are possible for you. Remove this cup from me. Yet not what I will, but what you will." And he came and found them sleeping, and he said to Peter, "Simon, are you asleep? Could you not watch one hour? The Sacrament of Communion Good Friday

On the night before he was nailed to the merciless cross, Jesus shared His last meal with His friends. He took the bread, He broke it, and He gave thanks, and then He passed it among them saying, **This is my body which is broken for you. Eat it and remember Me.**

He took the wine, and He gave thanks, and then He passed it among them saying,

This is my blood which is shed for you. Drink it and remember Me.

And so, we take, we eat and drink, and we remember: There is no greater love, than this sacrifice which You, Jesus, made for us;

> When we come to this meal, O Lord, we are reminded that it is the death and darkness in us, that drove You to the cross;And so we come with no pride, no sense of entitlement; we come humbly and with deep gratitude;For it is You alone that has made a place for us at Your table.

As you awaken us to your presence by your Spirit, may we know this bread and wine, to be your body and blood;
As you embrace us now, by your Spirit, may we be changed, so that together we become the embodiment of your love, of your life to the world.
