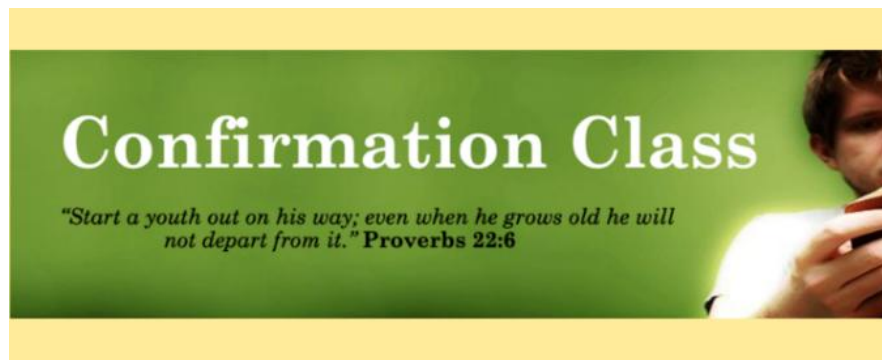

ST. JAMES CONSISTORY MEETING

August 5, 2025

6:31pm

- The meeting was called to order by President Scott Henschel. Members present were Jamie Henschel – Vice President, Sheila Hemb – Treasurer, Wendy Meyer – Secretary, David Lutze, Matt Lutze, and Pastor.
- Absent – Tanya Boman
- Prayer led by Pastor.
- Motion to approve the Secretary's Report made by Matt and seconded by Pastor.
Motion carried.
- Motion to approve the Treasurer's Report made by Wendy and seconded by David.
Motion carried.
- Pastor's report:
 - 7 kids are signed up for Vacation Bible School.
 - As Ann continues to receive treatment and recover, we are down 1 organ player. There are some Sundays that we will have to find alternate ways of providing music. Pastor is going to check with another person he knows, and we will have to check if there is anyone else available.
- Buildings & Grounds:
 - Blinking light in the sanctuary – Scott will replace this week.
 - Gutter Guards – the following quotes were received. 2 of the business' commented that the gutters are in poor shape. Plan to bring in front of the congregation in September.
 - EZ Flow Seamless Gutters - \$6700. Adding micro mesh to the entire church. 2 main runs would be removed and reinstalled using wedges instead of straps.
 - Altitude - \$4075. Gutter RX 5 inch screens. Clean out existing and install guards.
 - Oostburg Seamless Gutters - \$10,743. Install 5" seamless gutters on entire church. Remove existing gutters and reinstall new. Install 3 & 4 inch downspouts, add gutter cap – smooth coat.
 - Do we want to pull/spray the weeds in the parking lot and around church? Wendy and Scott will come next week and spray the parking lot. Wendy will pull weeds in the flower beds.
- Committee Reports:
 - Vision of Hope: Meeting end of the month.
 - Stewardship Committee: Next meeting in September
 - Christian Board of Education: Starting to work on registration and Sunday School teachers.
 - Social Committee: Sheila will discuss it with Tammy.
- Old Business:
 - Mission & Vision Statement Displays – David presented the information received about the lettering that would be added to the upper wall before you enter the sanctuary.
 - \$82.40 & \$100.00 to install. A motion was made by Jamie and seconded by Pastor to move forward.
 - Church Insurance – The original proposal received was that we could save \$300 - \$500. To move forward, we would have to provide a complete inventory of all removable items (tables, chairs, silverware, etc) and an inventory of all fixed items (pews, etc) and even after that, we wouldn't be guaranteed to see the reduction. The final cost will be decided after the underwriting is completed. She was also not very clear about what we would be losing by reducing coverage. It was decided that if we reduce coverage and would have to replace just

- the removable items, we will quickly exceed what we would be saving. It was decided to keep the coverage as is.
- Kitchen Clean up – Do we want to display the old kitchen items in the entry, so people look at them? Was it announced in church? We moved the items to the entrance and after 2 weeks, they would be donated.
- Outdoor Church Service review – There was a great turnout, great food, great music, and great weather. Approximately 65 – 70 people attended. Special thanks to Daniel and Katie Kleinhans on providing the great venue. It will be discussed at the next Joint Consistory Meeting if we want to book again for next year.
- New Business
 - Pick a date for Adopt-A-Highway – October 12 after church
 - Mission Fest – October 19
 - Ideas for speakers for Mission Fest – Need to look at past ideas and ask for further suggestions.
 - Are we going to have a sit-down dinner? Yes, it was decided we will go back to a sit-down dinner and continue with take-outs. We will ask the Confirmation students to help.
 - Get estimates on ham, potato salad, and cole slaw. Wendy will proceed with getting quotes.
 - Highlight a member every month – A suggestion was received if we would want to highlight a member of the church in the newsletter and alternate every other month with St. Marks. The final layout and questions are being finalized. The Consistory agreed it sounded like a good idea.
 - Pastor is on vacation from August 18 – September 1. August 24 will be a presentation by the Mission Team and August 31 will be covered by Julie M.
- Congregation concerns: none
- Next meeting date: September 2, 2025
- Motion to adjourn made by Matt and seconded by Jamie. Motion carried.
Meeting adjourned at 7:45pm.

August 7

Ben Grunwald called the meeting to order at 6:04 p.m. Members present were Ben Grunwald, Jody Binversie, Pastor Patrick Schultz, Judy Steinbeck, Linda Schroeder, Lori Roelse and Brenda Miota. Tyler Bramstedt was absent.

Pastor Schultz led us in prayer.

Financial Report:

- Judy Steinbeck noted the July income and expenses
- She reviewed several other accounts
- The General Fund is lacking due to more member donations towards the Building Fund; Judy will continue to post newsletter and mail requests asking members to funnel their donations to the General Fund now that the major building projects are close to completion

** In addition, the Consistory voted to approve the addition of Patty Taylor to have signing rights along with Mark Jurk and Lori Roelse for transactions associated with the Goeke Youth Fund managed by Riverstone Wealth Partners.

Jody Binversie made a motion to accept the report. Lori seconded. Motion carried.

Secretary's Report: Jody Binversie passed out copies of the July minutes. There were two corrections under the Financial Report (changing "firm" to "fund"). Linda Schroeder made a motion to accept the report. Brenda Miota seconded. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report:

- There was an update on organist Ann's medical condition. She will be unable to play for our upcoming service. Marcus Ellair will provide music instead on August 10, 2025. Music at future services is yet to be determined.
- Vacation Bible School has 16 children enrolled from several area churches. It will be held August 12 - 14, 2025.

Projects:

- Bell tower tuck pointing is on hold as Larry Perronne is finishing up the siding project
- Questions of where the topsoil is actually needed - garden fill or front lawn low spot; tabled
- Clean out and painting of garage interior/service window - Jody Binversie volunteered to head up the project

Old Business:

- *Just Say Yes*: Chapter 4 discussion - People have personal gifts/skills to share; encourage these people to come forward to share and cultivate their ideas; we must make our needs known - they don't need to be a church based, but open to community need; a quote to think about, "Churches exist, not for the insiders but for the outsiders. The moment a church begins to operate entirely for the benefit of those who already belong, it loses its missional focus and begins to die" (Robert Schnase, pg 61).
- Member/Family of the Month newsletter articles - Lori Roelse shared a handout of possible guiding questions
- Website Concerns - Karen Mansker requested via email a few changes which were made; there are still issues that need to be addressed (the old website redirect) and have been ignored; we will ask Karen to follow up one more time and then Pastor and Ben will call them directly
- Family Picnic - Next meeting is set for August 20, 2025; so far 23 people responded (6 children); there have been several donations; additional advertisements are still to come
- DSPS Permit (boiler and elevator) - Tabled
- Mission Statement Display - Kati Grunwald put together a few mock-up designs which Ben will share via email; we will need to find someone to do the work once a design is chosen
- Extra Keurig and table near entrance - Pastor will look into purchasing a second machine
- Fire Inspection Comments - Jerry Jetzer replaced the battery in the smoke detector

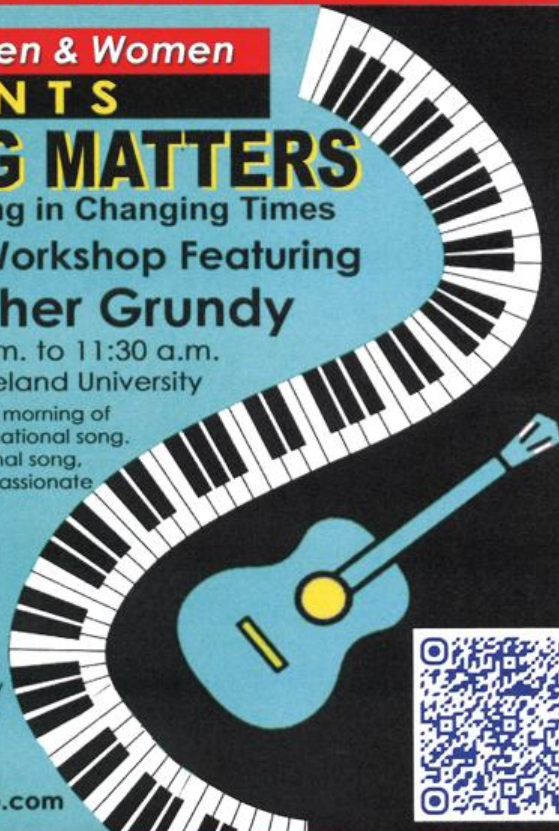
