

Judy gave the Financial Report. The budget balanced as usual. The Sunday, November 2, 2025 offering was outstanding. Missing two services in October was hard. She mentioned being grateful to the 25% of the congregation who give generously, but wondered how to reach the 75% who are not regular contributors. There was some discussion. Judy finished by offering to call a new insurance company who reached out to her recently. Tyler made a motion to accept the report. Lori seconded. Motion carried.

The Secretary's report was reviewed online earlier. There were no corrections. Linda made a motion to accept the report. Tyler seconded. Motion carried.



Christmas Cookie Exchange


What is better than Christmas cookies? Having several different varieties!

Exciting New Vendors: The Winter Market welcomes new prepared food vendors and features first-time participation from several Hmong vendors.


Outlook: The organization is looking forward to a great and successful winter market season! We anticipate a special visit from the North Pole at our December markets - 12/6 and 12/20!


