Advent Candle Lighting and Reading

Candle of Joy/Struggle

We light the candle of joy pausing and remembering these past weeks and months, the disbelief, the anger, the downtimes, the poignancy of reminiscing, the hugs and handshakes of family and friends, and all who have stood with us. We pray that your joy will be our strength.

Let us remember that dawn defeats darkness, and love overcomes fear.

Candle of Love/Fears

We light the candle of love remembering our faith and the gift of joy which the Christmas story offers to us. And too, we remember those whom we love that are no longer here this Christmas. We remember that God, who shares our life, promises us a place and time of no more pain and suffering where love and joy will abound.
