# ST. MARK'S CONSISTORY MEETING

## Regular Consistory Meeting – December 11, 2025

Ben Grunwald called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Consistory members present were Lori Roelse, Tyler Bramstedt, Brenda Miota, Pastor Patrick Schultz, Judy Steinbeck, Linda Schroeder, and Ben Grunwald. Jody Binversie was absent.

Pastor led us in prayer.

Judy offered the Financial Report. She was happy to report the current state of the finances has improved due to the generosity of our congregation. Our OCWM goal is short by \$2,000 at this time. It was decided to only give what has been collected. There was some discussion on the Goeke Youth Fund. Tyler made a motion to accept the report. Linda seconded. Motion carried.

The Secretary's Report was offered up online and reviewed earlier. There were no additions or corrections at that time. Linda made a motion to accept the report. Tyler seconded. Motion carried.

Pastor started his report by updating us on his upcoming surgeries in January. A letter is to go out informing the congregation. Keith Weiland, retired pastor from Howards Grove, will be filling in for Pastor in his 6-7 week absence. Pastor also reported on the improved relations and communications with our web provider. Karen is pleased to be working with a new individual, Kevin, who is more timely and cooperative. Third, Pastor passed around a brochure that he had picked up from Pilgrim UCC wondering if we could put together something similar for our congregation. He then mentioned the 10 year old age of the sign outside and inquired on upgrades by the installation company. Finally he informed us that the Confirmation kids did not visit Immanuel UCC on their scheduled date due to the weather. It shall be rescheduled.

The only projects left to be completed are the bell tower, louvers and railing. Tabled until the spring.

Old business:

- Ben dug into the DSPS inspection situation. He asked Judy to look at the insurance policy to determine who is named there as inspector of the boiler. If it can not be determined, we will need to call the state.
- Mission Statement Display is on hold in Jody's absence. She communicated that she would be following up with the sign company the next day.
- Mission Fest in November went really well. There was discussion on possible changes for next year. Tyler mentioned that the large coffee pot no longer percolates and could be replaced. Lori suggested we stick with only pies and tortes next year. We commented that the speaker was well received and discussed the possibility of donating a meal sometime soon for Home, Inc or at the Warming Center.
- The Social Media struggle continues. There was much discussion on the difficulty and expense in linking the Facebook posts to Instagram. It was suggested that we encourage members of the congregation to post Google Reviews via Google Maps in the meantime. We welcome all members of the congregation to post a review as well. ### New Business:

- Red Cross Shelter Location - Pastor responded to the emails from the Red Cross. We confirmed that we are a shelter location, but better for short-term as we have no beds or showers. Pets would not be allowed. Pastor and/or the St. Marks office will be contact points.
- Pastor's January/February schedule - Pastor's two surgeries are set for January 6 and January 22, 2026. Keith Weiland will start in Pastor's place on January 4, 2026 and continue serving for approximately 6-7 weeks. Dan Borschers is set to cover the February 1, 2026 service with Keith back on February 8, 2026. Pastor plans to be back on February 15, 2026.
- Snow removal between the parsonage, church and parking lot - Judy will call for a quote on the cost of the additional shoveling.

Christmas Eve services are set for 4:00 and 7:00 p.m with Communion. I, Brenda, will purchase the bread. Service commitments - Linda and Brenda at 4:00 - need two more; Lori, Ben, Tyler and Brenda at 7:00.

Our next meeting is set for Tuesday, December 30, 2025 at 6:00 p.m. Pastor will invite Keith Weiland to attend. Lori will extend an invitation to Wendy and Mike as well.

Pastor made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 7:48 p.m. Linda seconded. Motion carried.


- Stewardship Committee—continued...
