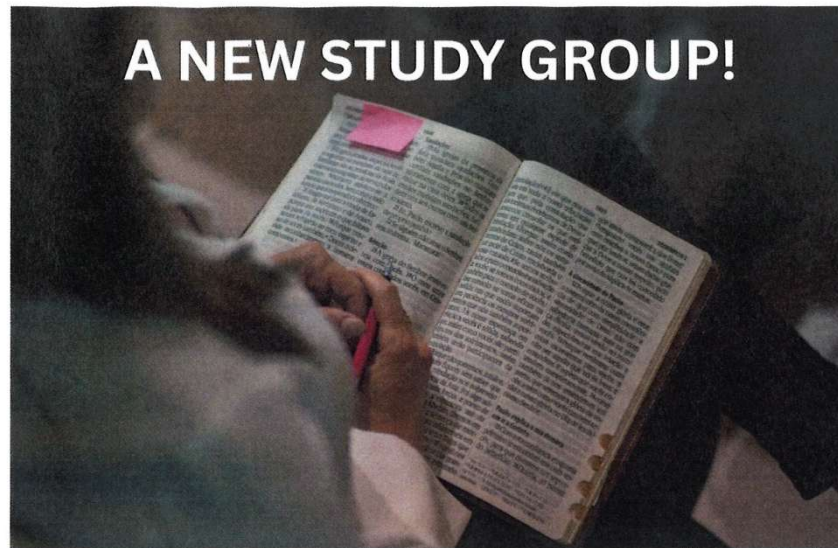

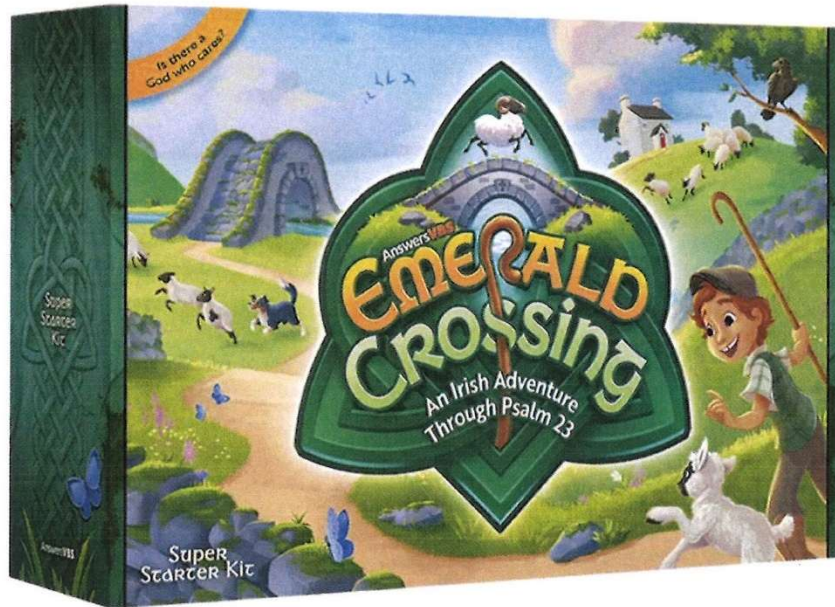

- Motion to approve the Treasurer’s Report made by Kris, seconded by Tanya. Motion carried.
  
- Pastor’s Report: Confirmation was discussed and comments were positive.
  
- Building and Grounds:
  - The new envelopes have been received and are ready for use.
  - We’re awaiting a response from T&L Landscaping. We are grateful to Mary Ann Vogel and Tammy Serketich for their donation of purchasing and replacing the landscaping stones.
  - Galen presented an estimate from Chappa Construction for work needed on the bell tower flashing. He is pursuing a second estimate.
  - We are grateful to those who participated in the yard clean up. It was completed by mid-morning.
  - We are also thankful to the eight Adopt-a-Highway participants. It took a short time.
  
- Committee Reports:
  - Vision of Hope: The Wagner Foundation appreciated the shared information and was pleased with the way their donation is being allocated.
  - Stewardship Committee: Envelopes are now available, and all are encouraged to use them for their giving. There will be refreshments after the service on Mother’s Day.

The meeting was called to order by Tyler Bramstedt at 6:09 p.m. Members present were Brenda Miota, Judy Steinbeck, Mike Bernhardt, Lori Roelse, Wendy Schueler, Tyler Bramstedt, and Dr. Rev. Patrick Schultz. Jody Binversie was absent. Jamie Henschel from St. James also sat in on our meeting.

Pastor led us in prayer.

The Financial Report was presented by Judy. She said we had a good month in April. As usual, all totals match up at the bank. Many of the accounts were either unchanged or building interest. Lori made a motion to accept the report. Pastor seconded. Motion carried.

The Secretary's report was read by me. In my absence, Jody took the minutes for April's meeting. Pastor clarified his vacation dates. Mike made a motion to accept the minutes. Wendy seconded. Motion carried.

# ST. MARK'S MAY CONSISTORY MEETING MINUTES, continued

## Pastor report:

- Pastor shared the summer VBS dates: August 18 - 20, 2026. We will again be teaming with Bethlehem UCC and Pastor Randy will assist with leading. Pastor is also at this time looking for volunteers to help with activities, lessons and snacks.
- He asked for our thoughts on Confirmation. Judy said she would have liked to have seen a receiving line, so the confirmands could all be congratulated. There will not be another class for either church for several years to come.
- He again mentioned his planned time off for vacation running from May 25 to June 7, 2026.
  - Rev. Kim Henning will provide services on May 31, 2026.
  - Rev. Dan Borchers will provide services on June 7, 2026.
- Next we discussed a high-pitched squeal in the parsonage kitchen area. He troubleshot many possible sources for the sound, but could not find it. After a conference call with Larry Perronne, we determined that Tyler would head over to the house after our meeting to check for a CO detector in the basement somewhere. (The source of the sound was found and rectified.)
- Pastor followed by mentioning a meeting that was to be scheduled with Jamie Henschel and all the organists regarding their monthly playing schedule. There was much discussion.
- Pastor finished by encouraging us to start the process now of seeking out a new pastor to replace him when he retires in January. Lori has not heard back from Jane Anderson yet, but plans to contact her again. A search committee needs to be formed with advice from Sandy Perronne and Deb LaDuke.
  - A Joint Consistory Meeting has been scheduled for Tuesday, June 2, 2026, at 6:30 at St. James to start discussing plans.

## Projects:

- Bell tower/ Louver improvements - tabled.
- Spring Clean-up Day discussion - Clean up went well and fast. It was decided that the two pine trees on the north side of the parsonage need to be cut down as well as the shrubs by the front door.

## Old business:

- Mission Statement Display - Pastor offered to put a design together and work the display himself. He will email out his design to us when completed.
- Website address on the sign - the company reached out to Karen recently about updates - tabled.
- Mission Trip Fund - there was discussion of still planning a meal for the Community Cafe which feeds people year-round and doing it again in the fall when the Warming Center reopens. Mike will call for more information.
- Leaks in the parsonage - nothing since the big rainfall in April.
- Leaks in the church - caused by a sharp piece of tuck-pointing that fell and was stepped on causing a hole. It has been fixed.
- Hospitality on Sundays - sign-up lists have been placed in the entryway to encourage more people to bring treats for social time following services.

## New business:

- Pastor's final service January 10, 2027; plan for one service at St. James at 10:00 a.m.
- Communion for Pentecost May 24, 2026; Lori will bake the bread.
- Sign updates - the sign company contacted Karen regarding updates.
- Mother's Day - Judy will pick up carnations for all the ladies of church for Mother's Day. Rebecca and Brianna Miota will pass them out.
- Pastor mentioned that in the afternoon after service on Sunday, May 3, 2026, he found that the church doors were left unlocked. He cautioned us to make sure all the doors are locked before we leave.
- Lori mentioned the Family Picnic set for Sunday, September 13, 2026. A committee needs to be formed. They will follow the same format as last year. Pastor again volunteered to sit in the dunk tank. There was more discussion.

The next meeting will be a joint meeting at St. James on Tuesday, June 2, 2026, at 6:30 p.m.  
Pastor made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 7:45 p.m. I seconded the motion. Motion carried.

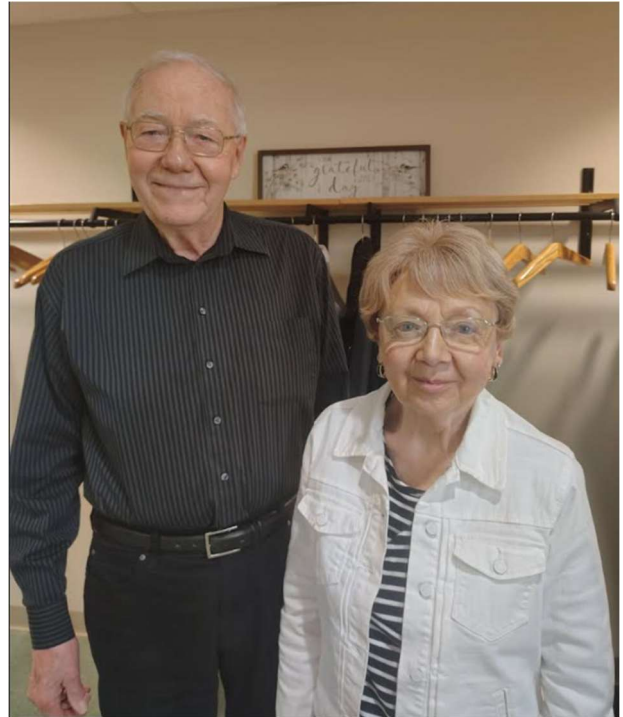

## Bulletin Bites - JUNE 2026



Dear Friends and Supporters,

We are reaching out today with humble hearts and an urgent need.

Recently, a failed sump pump caused flooding in the basement of Sheboygan County Interfaith Organization. While we are grateful that everyone in our programs remained safe, the damage has been impactful. The flooding required professional abatement and remediation services and installation of a new sump pump, and unfortunately, some of the items we rely on to care for families in our Bridgeway & Beyond transitional living program were lost.

One of the hardest impacts was the loss of stored mattresses, bedding, and household essentials intended for women and children. These are not simply “items” — they represent comfort, dignity, safety, and a fresh start for families rebuilding their lives.

As a nonprofit already working carefully with limited resources, unexpected emergencies like this place strain on our organization. We are asking our compassionate community to help us recover so we can continue providing safe, supportive housing and essential services without interruption.

Your financial support will help cover:

- Flood remediation and cleanup costs, and the costs of installing a new sump pump
- Replacement of mattresses, bedding, and household supplies
- Restoration of damaged storage areas
- Continued support for families in Bridgeway & Beyond

Every gift, no matter the size, makes a meaningful difference. Your generosity helps ensure that families experiencing homelessness continue to find hope, stability, and care through SCIO programs.

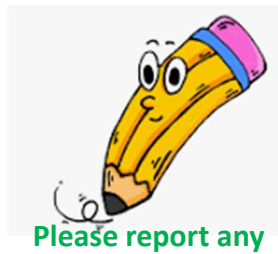
