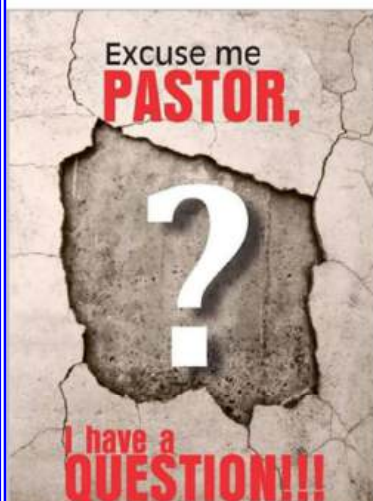

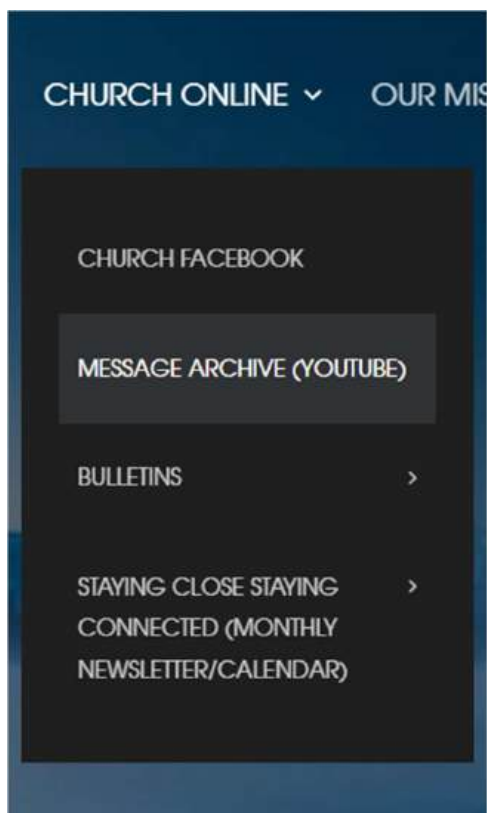

Jamie Henschel called the meeting to order at 6:35.

Lori recently spoke with Jane Anderson, Wisconsin UCC Associate Conference Minister, regarding our search for a new pastor. It was shared that the first step is to complete our church profile. Upon its completion, we can notify Jane Anderson and proceed from there.

Several members from the congregations have expressed interest in serving on the search committee. They include: Abigail Peterson, Sheila Hemb, Bill Heckmann, Christine Gumm, Tyler Bramstedt, and Lori Roelse.

Lori will copy and forward documents from Wisconsin Conference UCC for the profile committee to view. She will also serve as the contact person for questions pertaining to the whole process.

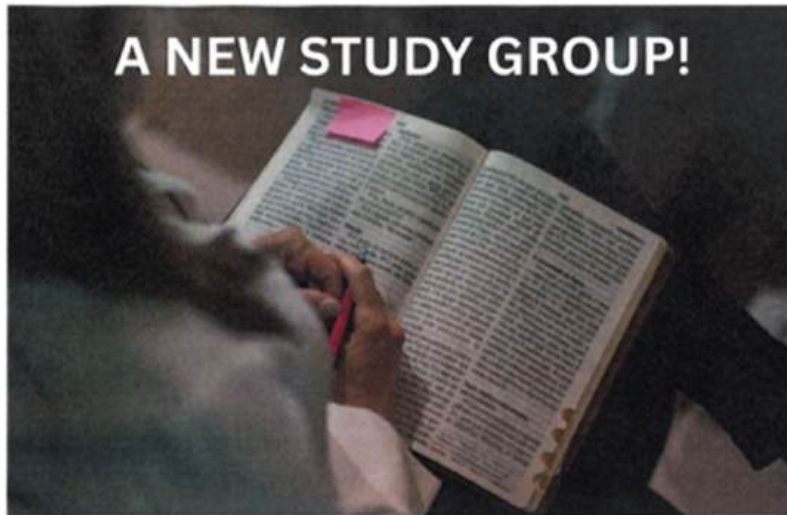
The meeting was adjourned at 7:28 with a motion from Galen La Duke and seconded by Tyler Bramstedt.
